Because DNA is anti-parallel, this means that the RNA polymerase is moving in the 3' to 5' direction down the template strand (Figure 2). Elongation. As elongation proceeds, the DNA is continuously unwound ahead of the core enzyme as the hydrogen bonds that connect the complementary base pairs in the DNA double helix are broken (Figure 2).
